If you have decided to send your child to our school, please keep this prospectus for reference.

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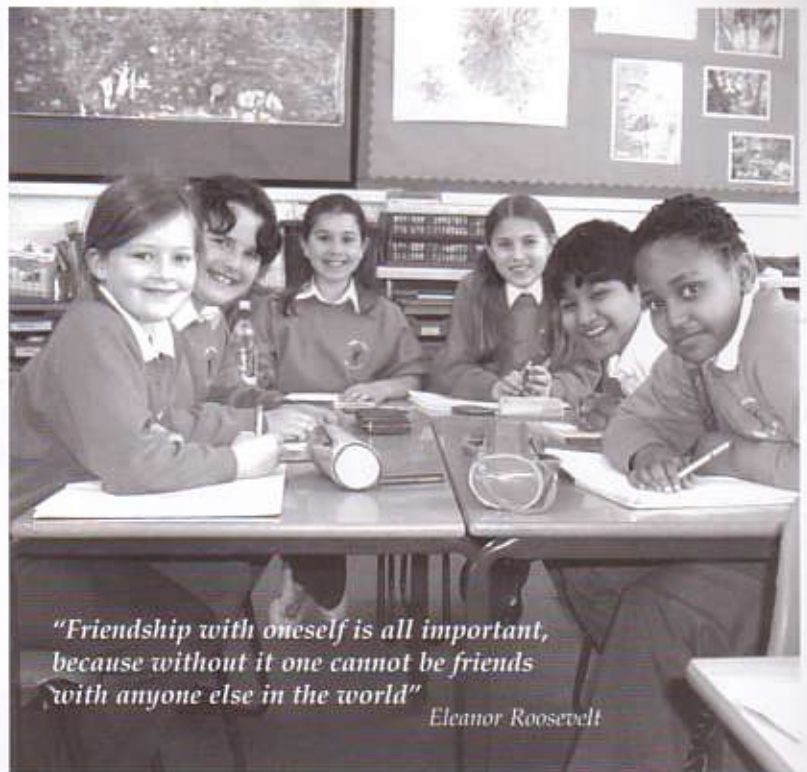
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KEY OBJECTIVES
